Background:

The CCG has said that it will prioritise delivery of the agreed plan in 13/14. This reports progress up to July. A second report will be produced on progress until October.

Analysis of key issues and of risks

Satisfactory progress is noted in most areas for the first 4 months of the year.

Three areas have either red areas or a number of amber scores.

- Mental health: Work has not yet started on procuring the Adult Mental Health Liaison Service which is an important part of the dementia strategy. The CCGs Mental Health Lead is prioritising the preparation work on this in August so papers will be ready for discussion with key groups and partners in September.
- Continuing Care, direct responsibility for delivering these priorities has transferred to the Commissioning Support Unit. The CCG's lead is confident the CSU will deliver before March 2014.
- CCG Commissioning Primary Care: This is a complex area where the CCG has to
 work in partnership with NHS England to deliver its objectives. Progress has been slow
 but a memorandum of agreement with NHS England is under discussion and should
 clarify responsibilities.
