Purpose:

The purpose of this paper is to review the progress of the Primary Care Team in relation to major work streams, the implementation of the GP Forward View (GPFV), and Investment and Evolution; the five-year Framework for GP contract reform.

Background:

The GP Forward View was published in April 2016 and Rotherham chose to incorporate the requirements into its interim strategy for General Practice, and developed a comprehensive document 'Rotherham's response to the GPFV'. It was agreed by the Primary Care Committee that the response document is still fit for purpose, but required refreshing and this was approved in November 2017 and also included a 'plan on a page'.

Investment and Evolution: A five-year framework for GP contract reform to implement the NHS Long Term Plan was published in January 2019. The actions from this document are included on a separate tab to the overall work plan. Those that are not applicable in terms of direct action are hidden from view but remain on the spreadsheet for tracking purposes.
